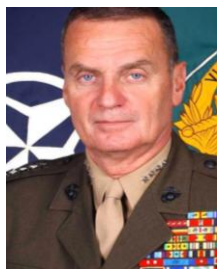

WHO WE ARE

Founded in July 1984, OIC is a non-profit, non-partisan, tax exempt, foreign relations research and advocacy organization. Currently, we advocate the use of cutting-edge resources to support foreign policymakers and related officials in producing unprecedented breakthrough results in their pursuit of peace and cooperation.

BACKGROUND

OIC was established as a NJ based 501C3 non-profit organization by founding members Arnold Keiser, Leo Sprague, Francesca Milanato, Barbara Fate, Sharon Thompson, Gene Rathbun, and Carol Rathbun.

OIC was founded as a non-profit, non-partisan, and non-positional organization dedicated to promoting public understanding of the work of the United Nations, peace education, public responsibility for peace, and the development of innovative international conflict and cooperation solutions.

OIC's involvement in the diplomatic community dates back to 1984, to when we were founded. Ranking current and former high-level diplomats contribute important input into our body of knowledge. Additionally, OIC consults with experts in conflict resolution and prevention from numerous organizations when needed.

OUR ACTIVITIES from 1984 to 1994 focused on projects to:

- Enhance US-Soviet friendship and cooperation. Projects included a ceremony honoring the work of the Soviet Mission at the UN, in addition to many efforts to expand media coverage for US-Soviet relations and to support the work of the United Nations. These efforts involved numerous media interviews, public speaking and executing public events in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.
- Encourage interest in young people to pursue work in international relations and Foreign Service via, [a] public speaking to high schools and universities, and [b] by two NJEA supported projects namely the US-Soviet Peace Prize Contest and our Young Diplomat Project.
- Support the work of affiliated NGOs such as the United Nations Association, the World Affairs Council, the Alliance for Peacebuilding, and the Business Executives for Nuclear Disarmament.

OUR PROJECTS from 1995 to 2006 focused on:

- Research into various human problem solving methods and their applicability to foreign relations
- Research into highly successful private sector ontology based breakthrough programs:
- Extensive networking with US, foreign and UN officials to understand their challenges.

OUR WORK from 2006 to the present:

- Discussions on the use of ontology based breakthrough programs took place throughout the UN, at embassies in Washington.
- Later, more discussions took place because of several referrals made by Former US Special Envoy Senator George Mitchell. The first referral was to a Deputy Secretary of State. This led to a presentation at the U.S. State Department.
